2. The Chancellor has made the decision that USG institutions will not move to a **Pass/Fail** grading scale. Please see his note to USG presidents below:

"Dear Presidents: Some institutions around the nation have decided to shift to Pass/Fail grading after transitioning to remote education.

There are numerous technical challenges in the University System of Georgia to shifting to P/F, and, in addition, I believe we can trust faculty to teach and grade students effectively as they always have. Therefore, we will not shift courses to grading P/F.

Please be sure to communicate this message to the appropriate people on your campus." — Chancellor Steve Wrigley

- 3. Students who **withdraw** from a course prior to the last day of class during spring 2020 will receive a W rather than a WF. Please ask students to meet with their advisors to discuss if withdrawing from a class will have a negative effect on their projected graduation date.
- 4. It is extremely important that students are aware of **online tutoring** services available.

  Please remind faculty of online tutoring resources available in your college and across campus

and ask them to repeatedly remind students. I have heard from several students who do not know how to access tutors or are not aware of the availability of tutors in specific disciplines. The SMART Center (Sciences, Math, Psychology, and other disciplines), Supplemental Instruction, Writing Center, and English as a Second Language Center are offering virtual academic support.
